Previous Scholarship Recipient

If there is one thing I have learned in my short time here on this planet, it is that you never really know where life will take you so sit back and enjoy the ride. If you asked me ten, five, or even one year ago what I would be doing at this very moment, I would have said something in production agriculture, but I would have never thought I would be writing an article for a newsletter while in my tiny graduate student office. The journey to where I am at today has been full of influential mentors, friends, family, and other supporting organizations. I am incredibly thankful to have received scholarships from the Colonial Agricultural Educational Foundation throughout my tenure in college to help make my education possible. Thanks to help from this scholarship program, numerous others, and my family, I was able to graduate from Virginia Tech in the Fall of 2021 with a bachelor's degree in crop, soil, and environmental sciences and a minor in agribusiness management debt free.
